Project Successfully Concluded!

The Agriculture for the Future Generations (AGFG) project has reached its final stage, marking the successful completion of an inspiring journey dedicated to empowering young people in agriculture.

Over the course of the project, partners worked collaboratively to design and deliver a comprehensive Training Course aimed at young farmers, breeders, and beekeepers. The course promotes sustainability, digital skills, entrepreneurship, and biodiversity awareness, contributing to a more resilient and future-oriented agricultural sector across Europe.

Training Course, now fully completed and available as an Open Educational Resource and easily accessible on our website <https://agfg-project.eu/>

The course includes four modules:

- Sustainable Agriculture & EU Policies
- Digital Skills for Agriculture
- Biodiversity & Sustainable Practices
- Career Development & Entrepreneurship

Through pilot workshops implemented in Cyprus, Romania, and Greece, the course was successfully tested and refined based on participants' feedback. The final result is an interactive, accessible, and practical learning tool for youth across Europe

Collaborating for Sustainable Agriculture

We are excited to share that AGFG and its training course material were recently presented within external events to increase visibility:

The SUPPORT project focuses on advancing sustainable agriculture through innovation, knowledge exchange, and support for farmers and rural communities across Europe. Why this matters? Both AGFG and SUPPORT promote more sustainable and resilient agricultural systems. Collaboration between EU initiatives is key to stronger dissemination, better alignment, and greater impact across Europe.



The OINO BIO project and AGFG share a common vision of promoting sustainability and innovation in the agri-food sector. Why this matters? While OINO BIO focuses on circular bioeconomy solutions and reducing waste in winemaking, AGFG empowers young people with digital skills and sustainability knowledge—together highlighting how innovation, education, and resource efficiency are key to building resilient and future-ready agricultural systems.

In Romania, GEO CLUB Association has proudly presented the project and its results during two events. First, we collaborated with DGT Network in order to share the information with highschoolers which attended a reading workshop, making sure that 25 young people learned more about agriculture and its opportunities. The second event was an intercultural gathering called Together we Rise with Turkish women and representatives of local institutions, at AHA Educational Center in Bucharest. Both actions encouraged the people to discover more about the meaning of sustainability in agriculture.



In January, Phoenix (Cyprus) presented its project during a single dedicated meeting that brought together both young people and farmers. The session created a valuable space for dialogue and exchange, combining diverse perspectives from different generations and backgrounds. Participants were introduced to the training course material, gaining insight into its content, objectives, and expected outcomes, while a pilot workshop allowed for hands-on engagement and interactive learning. The meeting successfully fostered collaboration, encouraged active participation, and strengthened connections between youth and the farming community.

Local Conferences: Sharing Knowledge & Impact

As part of the project's sustainability and dissemination strategy, Local Conferences were organised in each partner country during the final month.

These events brought together participants from the target groups, offering valuable insights into the project results, creating networking opportunities, and providing access to the developed training materials. The conferences played a key role in strengthening local engagement and ensuring the long-term impact of the project
