It aims to enhance their career prospects and contribute to rural and agricultural communities.

The project will produce a comprehensive Training Course for youth in agriculture, ensuring their essential knowledge and skills in farming, breeding, and beekeeping. Pilot testing will refine the course's effectiveness. Content will become Open Educational Resources. The results will promote biodiversity conservation, enhance youth employability and contribute to EU agriculture sustainability.



The AGFG project entered a key phase: the finalisation of the comprehensive Training Course designed to empower young farmers, breeders, and beekeepers across Europe.

The course built around four thematic modules — integrates sustainability, digital skills, and entrepreneurship. With content now fully developed, the digital transformation of materials has begun, including interactive tools like infographics, videos, and gamified quizzes to ensure engagement, accessibility, and practical learning.

Modules, focused on Career Development and Entrepreneurship in Agriculture, is now fully completed and will help young people explore career paths, build business ideas, and understand green innovation in agriculture. 🧰

Throughout recent months, AGFG partners have remained committed and connected. A series of regular online meetings enabled the partnership to co-create, review, and refine the training course collaboratively. These sessions provided space for critical feedback, creative ideas, and alignment across pedagogical approaches — ensuring the quality, inclusivity, and EU policy alignment of all modules.



Pilot Workshops

In-person pilot workshops, took place, in Cyprus, Romania, and Greece between Nov 2025 and Feb 2026. These events engaged young individuals from diverse backgrounds, who tested the training course, provided valuable feedback, and strengthened their skills.

Each workshop offered practical insights and fostered rich discussions around digitalisation, sustainability, and entrepreneurship in agriculture.
